

Conflict Minerals Statement

Scope: This Statement confirms our commitment to compliance with the Dodd-Frank legislation restricting the sourcing and supply of certain minerals and our affirmation that these minerals should not fund conflict groups. It applies to all employees, with a particular focus on those working with our supply chain.

We are committed to operating ethically and with respect for human rights, and part of this is our commitment to the responsible sourcing of minerals through our supply chain.

The US Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform Act of 2010 requires publicly traded companies to provide an annual report to the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) on the use of certain minerals in their products. The aim is to identify the source of these minerals and attest that they are not mined or transported in a manner that finances the ongoing conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Whilst not publicly traded, we support this transparency and traceability in the global supply chain. This means undertaking the due diligence needed to confirm that no metals or minerals classified as 'Conflict Minerals' are used in the manufacture of our cables and accessories.

The list of minerals covered by this Act are:

- Tungsten
- Tantalum
- Tin
- Gold

And the Conflict region is

- the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)
- any of the DRC's adjoining countries.

The only substance of concern within our product range is the use of tin-plated copper in some conductors and braids. Where a product is determined to contain these minerals, we will:

- Conduct a Country of Origin inquiry via our supply chain to confirm non-Conflict status.
- Request written confirmation of the ongoing compliance of our key suppliers with the Dodd-Frank legislation, in accordance with CMRT reporting
- Collate additional data identifying Smelters and processing plants where possible.
- Regularly reconfirm mineral status and ensure full traceability.

We are keen to work with companies who share our values and commitment to ethical procurement. None of our suppliers currently source their tin or tin-plated copper from these regions. Any non-conformance could result in penalties as appropriate under law, and removal from our approved suppliers list. We continue to maintain ongoing records of the declarations of compliance.

This Statement and our compliance with its contents is reviewed and maintained by the Management Review Team.

We strongly encourage and support responsible sourcing.
